

## **NORTH HARBOUR WOMEN'S CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.**

1. Play shall be governed by the Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and the Local Rules published on the day by Harbour Golf.
2. The venue of the fixture shall be that designated by the Association. The draw for the event will be sent to participating clubs.
3. The use of motorised assistance is prohibited. Dispensation will only be given on medical grounds established by the Women's Match Committee. Caddies require their own dispensation.
4. The Champion of Champions Cup, Bronze Champion Trophy and Harbour Golf Rosebowl shall be presented to the winners. The trophies shall be held by the winner's Club and returned to the Harbour Golf office, cleaned, by 31<sup>st</sup> October the following year. Harbour Golf will organise the engraving.

### **SILVER AND BRONZE CHAMPIONSHIP:**

1. The Club Champion and the Bronze Champion of all Clubs in the North Harbour Golf region may participate in this event. A runner-up may not take her place. However, the runner-up may take the place of the Champion in the Rosebowl Team. (Note: A Champion could be representing two Clubs.)
2. The competition shall be played over 36 holes of **gross stroke play**. In the event of a tie between two or more players, there shall immediately be a sudden-death play-off to decide the winner (committee to decide play-off hole(s)).
3. The Rosebowl will be played in conjunction with this event.

### **GROSS STABLEFORD ROSEBOWL:**

1. The competition is an NZ Golf team event open to all Clubs affiliated to NZ Golf. It is played in conjunction with the Harbour Golf Silver and Bronze Championships.
2. The gross Stableford scores of the winning team in each district will be forwarded to NZ Golf for determination of a national winner.
3. A Club team will comprise three members:
  - (a) The Silver and Bronze Champions and the Bronze Champion runner up; or
  - (b) The leading Silver Division player and the two leading Bronze Division players, if a Club has only an Open Championship (either stroke play or match play).
  - (c) Should a player be a champion of more than one club, she may play as a member of the team for each club.
4. Permitted substitutes:
  - (a) Silver and Bronze Stroke Play Championships:  
If a prescribed team member is unavailable, the Club may substitute the next available player who finishes closest to the winner in her division.
  - (b) Silver and Bronze Match Play Championships:  
If the Silver Champion is unavailable, the runner-up may be substituted.  
If either the Bronze Champion or runner-up is unavailable, a losing semi-finalist will be selected by lot. If a further replacement is required, the other losing semi-finalist will be eligible.  
Open Match or Stroke Play Championship:
  - (c) If a prescribed team member is unavailable, the Club may substitute the next available player who finished closest to the winner in her division.
5. District final:
  - (a) The competition will be 36-holes **gross Stableford** played on one day
  - (b) A team score will be the aggregate of the three team-member's individual 36-hole gross Stableford scores.
  - (c) In the event of a tie, a countback of the last 18 holes of the tied teams will apply to determine the winner. The count back will use the gross Stableford aggregate of the three players for the last 18 holes then 9 holes, 6, 3 or 1 hole.

### **VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIP:**

1. The Veteran Champion of all clubs in the North Harbour Golf region may participate in this event. A runner-up may not take her place. A Veteran must be aged 60 or over and is chosen by a club's own competition. The Veteran may already be in the field by means of being either of the Champions or the Bronze runner-up.
2. The competition shall be played over 18 holes of **gross stroke play**. In the event of a tie between two or more players, there shall immediately be a sudden death play off to decide the winner (committee to decide play-off hole(s)).
3. If the Veteran is already playing as part of a Rosebowl team, their first round is the one that will be counted for the Veteran's Championship.

### **9-HOLE CHAMPIONSHIP:**

1. The 9 Hole Champion of all Clubs in the North Harbour Golf region may participate in this event. This may be a club's Stroke Play or Match Play, 9-hole Champion. A runner-up may not take her place.
2. The competition shall be played over 18 holes of **gross stroke play**. In the event of a tie between two or more players, there shall immediately be a sudden death play-off to decide the winner (committee to decide play-off hole(s)).
